IMMIGRATION STORY AND HIS FOCUS
ON IMMIGRATION ISSUES**

Iván Espinoza-Madrigal is the Executive Director of the Lawyers for Civil Rights, The organization that filed lawsuits in the country recently to protect sanctuary cities; to save humanitarian protections on behalf of Honduran, Salvadoran, and Liberian immigrants; and to block immigration arrests in courthouses.

Iván is an expert and has filed and won dozens of life-changing and law-changing cases across the country on behalf of people of color and immigrants. He advises federal and state policymakers on the legal needs of marginalized communities. His work is regularly featured in publications such as the New York Times.

Iván speaks nationally on racial justice and immigration issues, often focusing on the legal needs of people who identify across

intersecting lines of race, sexual orientation, gender identity, and immigration status.

Before joining Lawyers for Civil Rights, Iván was the Legal Director of the Center for HIV Law and Policy where he supervised a legal team on national projects using HIV as a lens to address racial justice, criminal justice, immigration, and public health issues.

Iván serves on the Board of Directors of the New England Foundation for the Arts (NEFA). He also serves on the Greater Boston Latino Network's Steering Committee, the Hispanic National Bar Association's Civil Rights Section, and the Massachusetts Attorney General's Advisory Council on Racial Justice and Equity.
